And also, At the conference, we'll vote on churches leaving our conference and The United Methodist Church. This brings mixed emotions, so let's be kind and offer grace. Many have been exhausted and hurt by this process, including bishops and district superintendents. It has also affected conference staff, pastors, leaders, and members.

We should also be concerned about the broader trend of religious disaffiliation in our country. The rate of switching away from Christianity has been increasing since the 1990s. Projections suggest Christians could be less than 50% of the U.S. population by 2070.

These changes impact our budget and staffing. The proposed budget includes significant reductions, leading to staff restructuring and fewer districts. It hasn't been easy, causing pain and disappointment.

Jesus still walks with us

Jesus walks with us in our difficult journey. He doesn't abandon us when we're weary, lonely, confused, grieving, or hurting. Jesus joins us on the road, whispering in our hearts. As the morning breaks and the shadows fade, we experience His love, a pure and universal love.

With Jesus by our side, our hearts are set ablaze. His presence reignites our passion for mission, ministry, evangelism, and caring for those in need. His presence reignites our passion for justice and building a beloved community. His presence reignites our passion for life, love, and beauty. Even on our hardest days, Jesus whispers, "It's okay," and helps us take one step at a time. Eventually, our steps become quicker, filled with confidence, and even dance-worthy, as our hearts continue to burn with His love.
